The 1881 census sees John and Sarah Wood living at Moor Fields Horton with Sarah's father George Wood.

George Wood of Dairy House Bank Farm Horton, died on the 15th March 1931 at the Cottage Hospital Leek. Administration in London to William Wood father.

Sarah Wood the daughter of John Wood and **Hannah Heath** was born in 1862. The 1881 census shows Sarah Wood aged 19 a housemaid for her cousin Fred Powell and his Mary Ellen Powell nee Heath at 2 Bower Street Hanley. The 1891 living Park Hayes Horton and the 1901 living Lea Laughton shows Sarah living with her brother in law Abel Heath and sister Annie Heath nee Wood. In 1911 Sarah was still living with her sister Annie in Horton registered totally blind. Sarah died on the 17th July 1918 aged 56 years.

And it is further certified that it appears by a Receipt signed by an Inland Revenue Officer on the said Affidavit that on account of Estate Duty and interest on such duty has been paid, £ *3. 13. 11*
